In addition, it is the purpose of the Libertarian Party of Kansas (LPKS) to help ensure Kansans the protection from eminent domain abuse by force of private-to-private transfer (wrongly misrepresented with the ambiguous and much overused term of "economic development"). There is currently no constitutional provision prohibiting state or local government from taking private property except for public use, and there is no definition of "public use." In fact, the LPKS is proposing legislation to amend the state constitution to disallow private property from being taken except for public use, and private property shall not be taken without just compensation.
